CENTRELINK TERMINOLOGY

Every Ezytax computer will have a Notebook file available called **Centrelink Terminology**. It is a list of all Centrelink payment available and shows which section of the tax return they are to be declared in. These payments must be entered in the correct section of the tax return as it will impact the outcome of the return if entered in the incorrect section. The list is as follows:

ITEM 5 - Australian Government allowances and payments:

- Parenting payment (partnered)
- Newstart allowance
- Youth allowance
- Mature age allowance
- Partner allowance
- Sickness allowance
- Special benefit
- Widow allowance
- Austudy payment
- Exceptional circumstances relief payment or farm help income support
- Interim income support payments
- Cyclone Larry or Cyclone Monica income support payments
- Education payment of any of the following and the taxpayer was aged 16 years or older
- ABSTUDY living allowance
- payment under the Veterans' Children Education Scheme
- payment under the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act Education and Training Scheme 2004 – shown as 'MRCA Education Allowance' on the taxpayer's PAYG payment summary – individual non-business
- Training for Employment Program allowance; New Enterprise Incentive Scheme allowance; textile, clothing and footwear special allowance; Green Corps training allowance; or other taxable Commonwealth education or training payments

- an income support component from a Community Development Employment Project (CDEP) - shown as 'CDEP Salary or Wages' on their PAYG payment summary – individual non-business
- CDEP scheme participant supplement
- Northern Territory CDEP transition payments
- Equine workers hardship wage supplement payment

ITEM 6 - Australian Government pensions and allowances

- Age pension
- Bereavement allowance
- Carer payment
- Disability support pension and they have reached age pension age
- Education entry payment
- Parenting payment (single)
- Widow B pension
- Wife pension and either you or your partner was of age-pension age
- Age service pension
- Income support supplement
- Defence Force income support allowance (DFISA) where the pension, payment or allowance to which it relates is taxable
- DFISA-like payment from the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA)
- Invalidity service pension and they have reached age pension age
- Partner service pension.

Note: If the payment is to be entered in Item 6 then T1 in Tax Offsets must also be completed.

Also, on a clients Prefill report if they received one of the above Centrelink payments it will show which section of the return it is to be declared in. Under **label** there will be either a 5 or 6 to indicate which section to enter in.
